

EVALUATION CRITERIA

Division of Historical Resources HURRICANE MICHAEL NPS SUBGRANTS REVIEW AND RANKING

The subgrant applications are judged on the following criteria. Each is ranked with a possible 100 points total.

Please score each application individually. You should pre-score but you will have an opportunity to modify and/or finalize your scores during the public panel review webinar.

A list will be created of all subgrant projects in rank order based on an average of panelists' scores. In the event of a tie score, the tie will be broken by a motion and vote by the panel. The ranked list of projects up to \$8,054,000 will be sent to the National Park Service for final funding approval.

Criteria relating to Proposed Project

1. Historic significance (*up to 15 points*)

The relative importance of the property or site in connection with prehistory or historical events, developments or personalities.

2. Appropriateness of project proposal (*up to 15 points*)

Appropriateness of the historic preservation treatment proposed in relation to the preservation of the historic appearance and character of the site and the protection to be provided against existing or potential threats. This may also refer to the appropriateness of the proposed project in relation information that will be gathered through survey.

Criterion relative to Applicant Organization

3. Administrative capabilities (*up to 10 points*)

Administrative capability, as demonstrated in the application, including personnel, facilities and organization adequate to complete the proposed project and meet the administrative requirements of the grant.

Criteria related to Endangerment

4. Link between Damage and Hurricane Michael (*up to 20 points*)

Demonstration that damage to property or potential damage to survey area is linked to Hurricane Michael.

5. Need (*up to 20 points*)

Endangerment of historic/cultural resources as a result of Hurricane Michael.
Urgency of preservation and/or documentation of need.

6. Mitigation of Threat (*up to 20 points*)

Extent project substantially mitigates the threats identified in the application and how grant funding will be used to mitigate future damage.
