STANDARDS AND COMPLIANCE:

The proposed pre-contact geophysical survey might potentially be enhanced with the addition of a magnetometer; while the proposed historic survey activities might potentially be enhanced with the addition of a sub bottom and magnetometer. These additional datasets might aid in the identification of previously recorded and/or new features.

SCOPE ASSESSMENT:

The proposed project is appropriate in scope and meets the criteria established in the funding program overview. While some underwater projects narrowly and detrimentally focus on one temporal period (for example: historic), the proposed project seeks to assess the impact of Hurricane Michael across the entire breadth of the submerged archaeological record in the area. This approach is consistent with terrestrial surveys and represents a modern approach to submerged archaeological research. The proposed work seeks to assess a collection of historic and prehistoric submerged archaeological sites to determine their condition and identify the effects of major hurricanes on submerged cultural resources. The collection of this baseline condition across the area will aid in the future management of submerged sites.

BUDGET ASSESSMENT:

Submerged archaeological research is inherently costly due to the infrastructure required to reach, identify, and assess submerged sites. The proposed budget is consistent with the proposed scope of work, and with the large in-kind support this proposed project budget accomplishes a significant amount of research. Clarification might be requested concerning the estimated diesel fuel cost for the offshore component of the project as well as budget contingencies for possible weather delays.

Applicant notes trees uprooted by Hurricane Michael on several archaeological sites have disturbed site integrity.

Phase I involves analysis and sampling for OSL dating from existing site collections. Phase II consists of cleaning rootballs exposed by tree throws screening disturbed sediment, and cleaning undisturbed edges of tree throws for photographing and mapping of any intact stratigraphy.

CONCERNS/ISSUES:

If funded, grant administration cannot exceed 5% of the total project budget. OSL dating of existing collections to provide baseline for damage assessment. OSL dating of existing materials from sites that already contribute to the NR District. Nine months allotted for archival research at \$3500 per month. Six months allotted for OSL dating conducted by consultant. See Scope Assessment and Budget Assessment.

STANDARDS AND COMPLIANCE:

SCOPE ASSESSMENT:

The field component methodologies for assessing damage to the sites is appropriate. Dating of materials to bolster NR District amendment is fine, although may not be necessary for all four sites as 8WA316 and 8WA321 are already contributing resources to the NR district.

It is unclear how collections analyses, including OSL dating, of materials from these four sites will prior to the field work component will provide a "baseline for comparison with the condition of the sites subsequent to Hurricane Michael." The Phase II component includes additional analysis and OSL dating of materials collected during the the proposed field component.

BUDGET ASSESSMENT:

9 months are allotted by the applicant for Initial review of archival records. Another six months are allotted for OSL dating of ceramics from existing collections. Item 1 "reflects the time spent by the Principal Investigator of the project on the review of archival material, collections, and the preparation of the required National Register nomination at \$3,500 salary per month." Nine months of archival research for the scope of this grant seems unnecessarily long in duration. Nine months background research at \$3,500 per month as well as the consultant fees (Item 5) expended over two rounds of OSL dating (Item 3) seems to be an excessive expenditure.

Allow for professional Architectural / Engineering fees if grant funds are to be used for payment.

Delete "Ceiling painting" from the Project Budget as a non-allowable line item.
